
Junior Disco

Summarise your netball style

I would say I'm quite a quick player and I think more about strategy and techniques to get the ball rather than just running.



Tell me about your netball journey to date?

I first got interested in netball after doing interschool in primary school for years 4 and 5, and in year 6 decided to join a club. Tingara was the closest as I attended Brentwood Primary. I started at both ends of the court, as a mix of shooting and defending (GA and GD) but as the years went on, I started to play more and more defence and less attack and now I am just solely a defender.

You have just made the U15s WA State Team for netball. First of all - congratulations - and second, how much work does it take to make one of these teams?

Thank you. To make one of these teams is pretty tough and it does come with a lot of workload. It first came with 2 trials on different days, one half day and then one full day. After the full day trial, there was an interval of 2 days for the list of the squad to come out. It started out with 317 girls, and the squad comprised of only 30 girls.

I was really excited when I made it to the squad team. The squad team underwent a whole month of training sessions on Fridays (1.5 hours) and Sunday mornings (2 hours) which were compulsory. Daily fitness, different courses and circuits were to be completed a minimum of twice a week and/or strength and conditioning (not including club or FNA training) plus recovery and stretching. And you have to remember having the right mindset and not putting too much pressure on yourself.
